You can also enjoy the local museum and shopping at the local artisan markets. The absence of over-priced tourist traps adds to Portobelo's small town charm. Hiking trails overlook the harbor where Spaniards once were on the lookout for English pirates. The deep water harbor provides access to sailing and boating activities. The surrounding area is popular with scuba divers, and this part of the coast contains some un-crowded surfing breaks. The gorgeous white sand beach of Playa Chiquita is also nearby. The San Blas Islands were named the 3rd best tropical paradise by Lonely Planet in 2011. Besides a place of pristine white beaches, sparkling clear water, and tropical foliage, the islands are home to the Kuna Indians. Since the Kuna control their lands you won't find concrete and steel hotels in their territory, but you can discover plenty of uninhabited islands to explore.
